4 PILLARS - Be Joyful

In April, we will continue our Faith Coach lessons focusing on our 4 Pillars (Be Joyful, Be Humble, Be Loving, Be Forgiving) with all classes. This month, the focus of our faith lessons will be on the pillar 'Be Joyful'. This is a wonderful way for our students to learn how we show love towards one another and being loving can be demonstrated by our students using their talents and capabilities to show:

- Kindness: be kind to one another, simple acts such as complimenting, holding doors, open helping a classmate with their work can make a big difference
- Inclusion: including others and fostering an inclusive environment where every student feels valued and accepted, reach out to those who may feel lonely, and invite them to join in
- Respect: respect others, regardless of differences in background, beliefs, or abilities, listen attentively to their peers, speak politely and treat everyone with dignity
- Empathy: show empathy by considering others' feelings and perspectives, offering support and understanding to classmates who may be going through difficult times
- Acts of Service: participate in acts of service both within the school community and beyond, volunteering at community events, helping our within the school
- Positive Communication: using words that uplift and encourage others and avoiding gossip or hurtful language
- Friendship: cultivate meaningful friendships built on trust, loyalty and mutual respect, being a good friend and supporting peers through both good and bad times
- Forgiveness and Reconciliation: demonstrating forgiveness by apologizing when they have wronged someone and fostering a culture of grace and understanding within the school community

As Catholics, we are called to be agents of healing and reconciliation, spreading love and compassion wherever we go. By practicing these behaviours, our students can create a culture of love and kindness within our school community, making it an even more supportive and uplifting environment

COLLECTIVE CARING - Cultural Stereotypes and Racial Remarks

Last month we shared that our staff actively engaged in learning and responding to issues of racism at our February 2nd Professional Development Day. Our staff are engaging in conversations with students aimed at creating a safe and inclusive environment for all students promoting diversity, equity, and understanding within our school community. Your support in this journey is invaluable, and we look forward to fostering meaningful dialogue and positive change together. There are steps we can take together:

Open Dialogue: Let's have an open and honest conversation about the impact of words and actions. Help your child understand why certain comments are hurtful and the importance of showing respect to everyone.

Education: We can provide educational resources and materials to help gain a deeper understanding of different cultures, the harm caused by stereotypes, and the value of diversity.

Setting Boundaries: Establish clear boundaries regarding appropriate behaviour and language. Consistent reinforcement of these boundaries will help our students internalize respectful conduct. Leading by Example: As adults, we play a significant role in shaping our students' attitudes and behaviours. Let's strive to model inclusive behaviour and demonstrate respect for all individuals in our interactions.

Seeking Support: Explore additional support resources, such as counselling or workshops, to further address and prevent such behaviour.

Our goal at school is not to assign blame but rather to foster growth and understanding. By working together, we are confident that we can navigate any challenges and develop our students into compassionate and respectful individuals.
